Pronoun Pattern

Some pronouns take the place of a singular noun. Other pronouns take the place of plural nouns. If a pronoun refers to only one person, it is singular. Pronouns such as **her**, **mine**, and **his** only refer to one person, so they are **singular** pronouns. **We**, **our**, and **they** refer to more than one person. These pronouns are **plural** pronouns. **You** and **your** can be **singular** or **plural**.

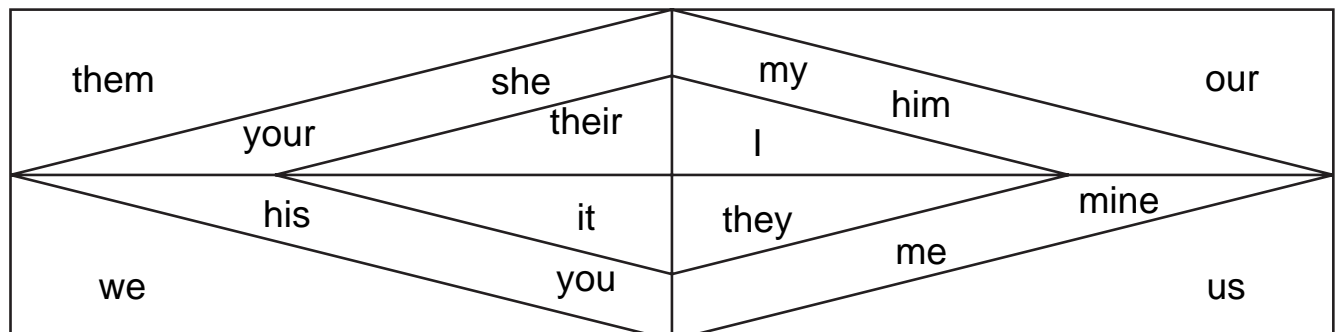

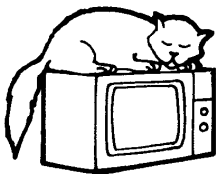
