Souvenir Barn Basket (cont.)

Animals

Materials

- Animal Patterns on pages 41–43 for each child, or color versions, folded farm animals.pdf on the CD
- heavy paper or cardstock
- markers or crayons
- cotton balls, scrap paper (optional)

Teacher Preparation

- 1. Copy the Animal Patterns onto heavy paper for each child to color or make color copies.
- 2. Cut out the Animal Patterns.
- 3. Flatten the animal pieces so the children can refold them.

Procedure

- 1. Fold each animal on the dashed line.
- 2. Add details to each side of an animal using the materials provided.
- 3. Try using markers or scrap paper to add spots and udders to the cow and a tail for each animal. Use cotton balls for the sheep's wool and a goatee for the goat.

Souvenir Barn Basket Assembly

Materials

- Barn (see directions on page 38) for each child
- Animals (see directions above) for each child
- School-Home Connection Ticket on page 43 for each child

Teacher Preparation

- 1. Copy the School-Home Connection Ticket for each child.
- 2. Gather the completed Barn and Farm Animals projects for each child.

Procedure

- 1. Place the School-Home Connection Ticket in the barn basket.
- 2. Walk each animal into the barn.
- 3. Have children take home the Souvenir Barn Basket to share with family and friends.

School-Home Connection

Making the Barn Basket provides each child with a souvenir of the farm unit to take home to share what he or she has learned. By sending home this handmade souvenir, along with a copy of the School-Home Connection Ticket, each child will be encouraged to discuss what he or she has learned during the unit. Parents can use the prompts on the ticket as a springboard for discussions, songs, stories, and other activities from the farm unit.

Teacher Note: Don't forget to have an official passport stamping at the end of the farm journey.

"Five Little Seashells"

Readiness Standards -

Gross Motor

 uses stick puppets to participate in activity

Math

- counts backward
- one-to-one correspondence

Listening

- listens for a variety of purposes
- acts out familiar rhymes

Materials

- Seashell Patterns on page 194 or the color versions, seashell patterns.pdf, on the CD
- "Five Little Seashells" poem (below)
- craft sticks and tape

Teacher Preparation

- 1. Copy, color, and cut out the Seashell Patterns or make color copies.
- 2. Using tape, attach each seashell pattern to a craft stick to make a set of seashell stick puppets.

Procedure

- 1. Say the rhyme "Five Little Seashells" a few times to get the rhythm going.
- 2. Give each of five children one seashell stick puppet to hold. Have them stand up and hold the puppets so that they are visible to all the children.
- 3. Encourage the group to help recite the poem as the children with the seashell stick puppets perform the corresponding actions.
- 4. When each seashell is taken by the waves, a child will sit down with his or her seashell puppet. Continue in this manner until all the seashells have disappeared!
- 5. Repeat steps 2–4 so that each child has a turn to hold a seashell stick puppet.
