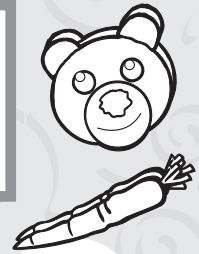

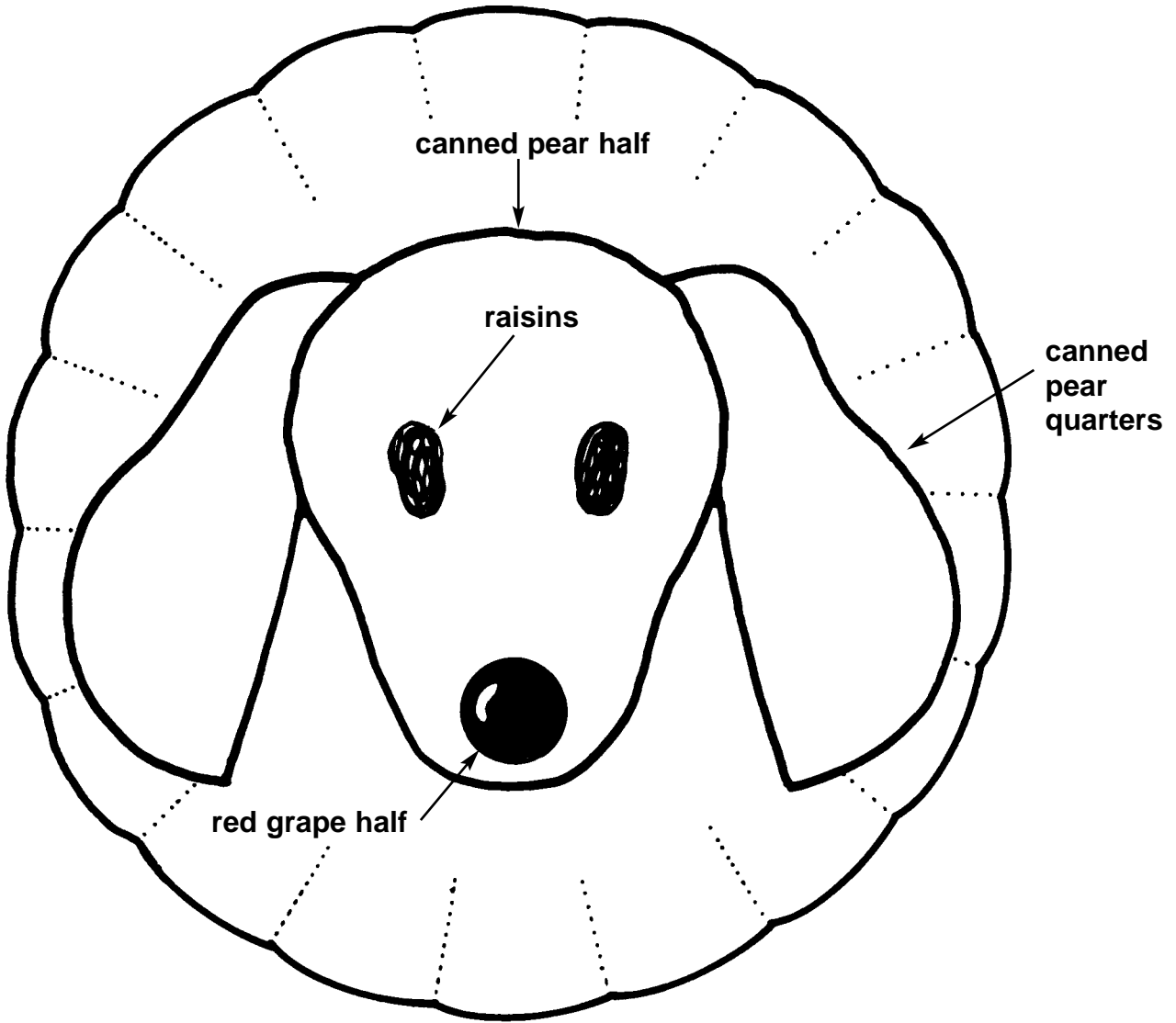

# Dog



## Ingredients

- 2 canned pear halves
- 2 raisins
- 1 red grape

## Utensils

- cutting board
- paring knife

## Let's Do It!

1. Place one pear half hollow-side down for face.
2. Cut other pear half in two lengthwise and place hollow-side down on either side of the dog's face for its ears.
3. Cut grape in two crosswise for a round nose, lengthwise for an oval nose.
4. Assemble as shown.

## More Ideas

- Use fresh pears; peel and core before arranging as described.
- Put spots on the dog with raisins.
- Conduct a survey to see how many children have dogs for pets. How many have cats or other animals?

## Leftovers

Pear and cottage cheese salad: Make a salad by filling pear halves with cottage cheese. Sprinkle with raisins and/or grapes. Serve on a lettuce leaf.
