## **Five Little Turtles**

One little turtle, all alone and new.

(Place one little turtle on the flannelboard.)

Soon he finds another, then there are two.

(Add a second turtle.)

Two little turtles crawl down to the sea.

(Add the wave with one turtle hidden behind it, and move turtles towards it.)

Soon they find another and then there are three.

(Add a third turtle.)

Three little turtles crawl along the seashore.

(Add shells to the front of the wave. Move turtles along the edge of the wave.)

Soon they find another and then there are four.

(Add a fourth turtle.)

Four little turtles go for a dive.

(Place the four turtles on the wave.)


Along swims another / and then there are five.

(Bring out the hidden turtle to join the other four.)

Use the patterns on pages 26-27 to make five little turtles, shells, and a wave. If room allows on your flannelboard, double the pattern of the wave to make it longer.




## **Patterns for Five Little Turtles**



- 1. Cut out five green turtles. Add google eyes if you wish.
- 2. Add lighter green shells to each turtle.

**Note:** Reduce the patterns and apply Velcro® to the back of the felt pieces if you wish to use the turtles as finger puppets on a glove.

## Patterns for Five Little Turtles (cont.)



- wave
- 1. Make two blue waves and connect them.
- 2. Make as many white, beige, or pink shells as needed to line the "beach."
