Irregular Verbs

Many verbs end in ed when you put them into the past tense.

Examples: The driver *honked* the horn.

We walked six miles to the park.

For some verbs, you do not simply add an *ed* to put them into past tense. They are called irregular verbs.

Examples:

Present tense	Past tense	
spy	spied	
hide	hid	
bring	brought

Sometimes, other words in the sentence can give clues as to which tense the verb should be in. Words such as *yesterday, last month*, and *previously* show that the action occurred in the past. Words such as *tomorrow, in the future*, and *next week* show that the action will occur in the future. Likewise, verbs in the same sentence often share the same tense.

Quotation Marks


Quotation marks should be used any time someone speaks. One set of quotation marks should be placed at the beginning of the quote and one set at the end.
